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## **Medical Plan**

1. The Chief of Competition (COC) will appoint a Chief of Medical (COM) or assume those responsibilities themselves for all races held at Calabogie Peaks Resort.
2. The COC or COM shall liaise with the Calabogie Peaks Resort Ski Patrol and/or the Canadian Ski Patrol System lead to inform them of the schedule for the race and request their presence at the race.
3. Members of the Calabogie Peaks Resort Ski Patrol or Canadian Ski Patrol System shall be stationed with a toboggan at the top of the course prior to the commencement of racing. Should a patroller depart the position to attend to an accident, a replacement patroller (and toboggan) should be in place or in transit before racing re-starts.
4. In the case of an accident requiring attention from the ski patrol the jury member nearest the accident should request a patroller from the Start Referee.
5. In the case of an accident, no race volunteers or spectators should touch the injured athlete.
6. Upon assessment by the ski patroller, the injured athlete may be transported to the bottom of the racecourse by toboggan under the supervision of the patroller.
7. The athlete may then be transported by toboggan and skidoo to the patrol office in the main lodge.
8. If necessary the athlete will be transported by ambulance to the nearest hospital.
9. Once the ski patrol takes charge of the athlete, all communications to arrange transportation such as with hill operations for the use of the skidoo or to summon an ambulance are the responsibility of the ski patrol.
10. The nearest hospital to Calabogie Peaks Resort is in Renfrew, Ontario – approximately 32 km.
